The Master reports that upon the night of the 6<sup>th</sup> inst. immediately after the sitting of the Board the Baker gave notice that he would give no more bread, in consequence of whereof the House was in want of Baker's Bread during Saturday and Sunday, and since have not received the usual supply, even yesterday I received none until an advanced hour in the day, owing to this circumstance, I was obliged to establish a temporary dietary in the commodity of oatmeal Cake, on days which the Vaupes were supplied with soup & with which I was obliged to supply the few convalesced cases, as also the other cases undergoing medical treatment, to such of them as bread is prescribed, receiving 8 lb of oatmeal on this week, which was of a bad quality, Master respectfully requests the Guardians to correct such abuses as thus stated, or if suffered to be practiced will eventually place the house in such a state as tends to confusion & disturb its arrangements, & placing difficulties in the way of the Master over which he can have no controul
