N^o 15965/1837 requesting to be informed of the explanation given by the Guardians on the subject of the report of one of the visiting Committee

In reply to the Commissioners letter, relative to a report from a member of the visiting Committee and requiring an explanation, they state that the book in question has been punctually filled up and posted by me every evening, since it was ordered to be kept by the Guardians and that it was closed to the previous night, from a Mem. Book which I kept in my store at the time

the visit was made as testified by the lists of the Union. Both regard to that part of the report which stated that I was indifferent as to the accuracy of the book. I merely said that as all the Supplies for the day were not delivered the book could not be posted with accuracy, as there was only one Column for the deliveries of each day and if kept otherwise as far as was aware of that it might lead to confusion and mistakes. but as the Book was not one of the Commissioners Terms I said I would keep it any way the Guardians should order with respect to the Milk. I boiled the Milk of both Contractors about 8. A.M. and it did not break or get into Chey. and it produced the average quantity of Cream. as the weather is so dry I have made arrangements to receive Supplies of Milk Monday and evening. so as to secure a fresh and sweet supply of it and I am sure will tend much to the Comfort and health of the Sick and Infants -

The medical officer reports the health of the inmates continuing satisfactory. That on Monday last the master reported to me that one of the foundling children in the Nursery had died that morning, and that the woman in charge of the child who had been previously in a very delicate state and associated state had cruelly ill-treated it, he made an examination of the child, and found one black spot on each cheek. I recommended the master to have an enquiry into the matter, I discovered no other marks of violence.

It would be very desirable if the Board would make some arrangement to secure the services of competent persons, to care the Hospital patients.

The Guardians have enquired into the above & find the charge has not been supported.

The following Letter was received from the Rev. Mr. Madden,
To the Chairman of the Board of Guardians

Sir

On the night of the 3rd Inst. I was passing by the Workhouse gate about 10 o'clock. And asked the little boy at the Gate why it was open, not closed. it being then 10 o'clock he said the Master was out. on my return at half time about 11 o'clock. I saw to the best of my belief a person getting over the gate. I climbed the gate immediately, and told the Master who was then standing with his back to the Entry box, that it was a shame for him to be out so late. This I repeated several times, but he made no answer. Seeing to the best of my knowledge a second person inside. I said I should insist on knowing who was with him, hearing two boys passing by the gate. I called on them to climb the gate after me. Should any thing wrong happen. The Master then spoke and said I had no right to climb the gate. at this moment the Porter appeared. When I told the Master he should keep regular hours. he answered by calling me a scamp and a blaguard. And swore by his God, that if he caught me getting over the gate again, he would shoot me with his gun. I called on the Porter to witness these expressions.

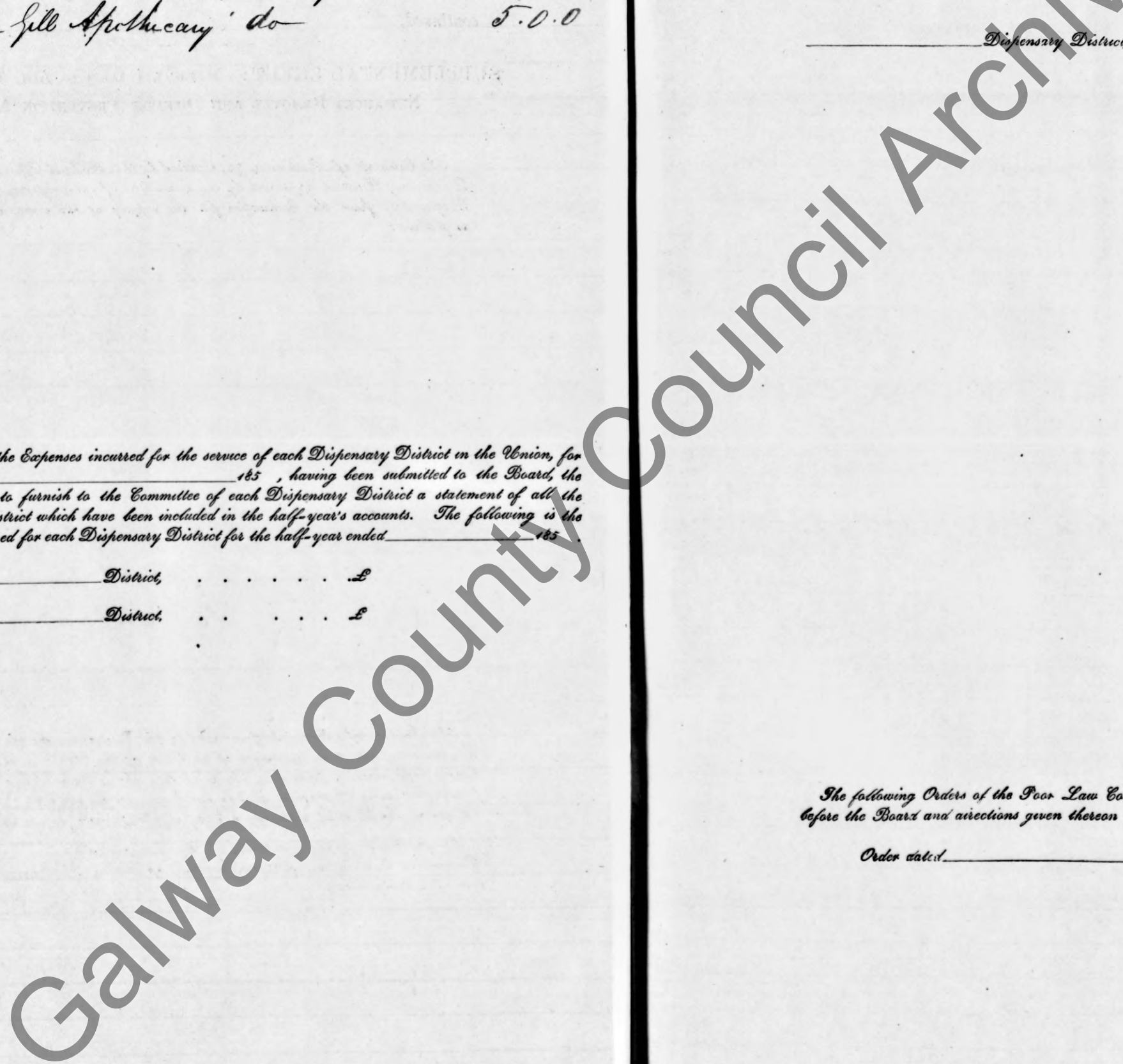

The following Letters from the Poor Law Commissioners and others were read by the Clerk, and directions given to answer them respectively, to the following effect, (or orders made on them respectively as follows:)

Letter from Poor Law Commissioners, No 19695, 28 July 1857 referring to the Guardians, Resolution of the 23rd Instant in reply to the Commissioners, letter of the 22nd Inst. relative to the case of a Foundling child who was reported to have died in the Workhouse as alleged from Cruelty & ill-treatment. The Commissioners desire that the subject should receive further consideration and request the Guardians will direct the Master to make a report of the grounds upon which he brought the charge forward.

The Master reports, that on the morning of the 13th Inst. he heard two women speak about a child who died in the nursery, that turning on making inquiry it appears that the woman Margt Brown who had charge of the infant, had a dispute with paupers Bridg Kelly & Bridg Mahony they stated that Brown ill-treated the infant the night previous, by slapping it on the cheek, the Master immediately reported the circumstances to the Medical Officer who examined the body and found no marks of violence except one small black spot on the right cheek, the child was in a very emaciated state for some weeks, and was convulsed very much for days previous to its death.

Letter from same No 19695 28 July 1857 referring to a Report of the Rev^d In Madden @ that he had been informed by Bridget Mahony a pauper Inmate of the Workhouse, that she was invited to commit an act of immorality with an Officer of the House, The Com^{rs} request to be informed whether the name of the Officer has transpired. It is desirable that a Workhouse Officer accused of such a crime should be afforded an opportunity of clearing himself of the charge.

The Master is the person alluded to in Mr Madden's report and he requests an investigation by the Inspector.

The Master sent in the following explanation in regard to the charges made against him in the Rev^d In Madden's letter to the Guardians on Minutes of the 16th Inst. —

Govt Workhouse 30 July 1857

Gentlemen

In accordance with directions from the P^L Commissioners requiring my explanation of the charges preferred against me by the Rev^d In Madden @, I beg to say that some of the vegetables, Hay and Grass having been stolen off the W^House lands, and on the night in question seeing some persons at the outer gate, who I suspected some of the party who had stolen them, I made an arrangement with the Porter to stop up for a few hours and watch, &c &c, and in passing round by the front house I saw Mr Madden come to the gate frequently and brought one of those persons away with him, he came after and I believe must have known that I was inside, for he called me a coward, and said if I was a man to show myself, having repeated this several times, and getting no answer from me, he climbed the Gate, I then said that it was contrary to rules to get over it, particularly at that late hour 11 P^M, and in the presence of the men outside, who he desired to follow him if anything should occur, after this he called me a blackguard & Russian &c. I then said that the person who used such language, and conduct was nothing better, he then threatened to knock me down, on this account I said I would summon him, and that he was liable to be shot for scaling over an enclosed place. The next day he came to the Workhouse I was cautionsing a female inmate about being out of her place, he asked what I was saying, came up to me and put his clenched hand to my face and said I was

 an unmarked man, The Sunday following the 5th he called the Porter and asked him, if he Mr Madden took off his coat to fight on the night he climbed the Gate, and on several occasions he has beaten and kicked inmates of the Workhouse without provocation, I would have mentioned his conduct to the Board ere this, as well as, have summoned him but being a clergyman and aware of his hot temper, I did not wish to interfere with him.

The Poor Law Commissioners will conceive the spirit in which he acts towards me, when they are informed that he has on more than one occasion caused much annoyance to respectable people in Gort for which he was reported to Dublin Castle and to his Bishop, and it would be more in accordance with the calling of a clergyman, as well as, the rules of the B. Comm^{ts} were the R. Chaplain or his Curate Mr Madden to preach to the inmates, or catechise the children which is seldom or never done. —
