Letter N<sup>o</sup> 12,738 date 22<sup>nd</sup> March advising, to letter of the 27<sup>th</sup> ult relative to the formation of the Electoral Divisions of Frongoch and Killinor into a Medical Dispensary District and requesting the guardians views on the subject.

With reference to the foregoing the guardians of the Poor of the Loughrea Union beg to state for the information of the Commissioners that the great evil of the former Dispensary system was, that while the professed object was the relief of the Poor, in too many instances the real object was to make a convenient provision for a Medical friend.

Discarding all such notions the guardians of the Loughrea Union after mature deliberation adopted the suggestion of the Commissioners Inspector D<sup>r</sup> Dillon and they have with the

sanction of the Inspector suggested to the Commissioners the Dispensary District stated in form N<sup>o</sup> 2.

They have for many reasons great objection to any connection directly or indirectly with any other Union. They feel convinced that it will be for the benefit of their Union that their Medical Officers & Dispensary medicine bills should be exclusively under the superintendence & control of the Committee of this Union. They feel convinced that no second Medical Officer will be required for the Loughrea District, that from the diminished state of the population, almost all those entitled to gratuitous Medical aid being already in the Workhouse where in all necessary cases they receive such aid at the expense of the Union.

Upon occasion of an epidemic, temporary assistance should become necessary the guardians are in a position to procure such aid at a much less expense to the Union than would be incurred by the adoption of the permanent arrangement suggested in the Commissioners letter before referred to.

Letter N<sup>o</sup> 15,574 date 26<sup>th</sup> March advising to Resolution and Minutes of the Vestry requesting assistance for certain Electoral Divisions from the Rate in aid fund & stating the Commissioners could not apply for any further assistance for the Union.

Mr. Bourke, the Inspector having brought under the notice of the Board the present defective accommodation for the aged and infirm inmates of both sexes & having recommended the Board to erect working sheds in the male & female yards whereby the apartments now used for these purposes might be made available for the aged & infirm as originally intended.

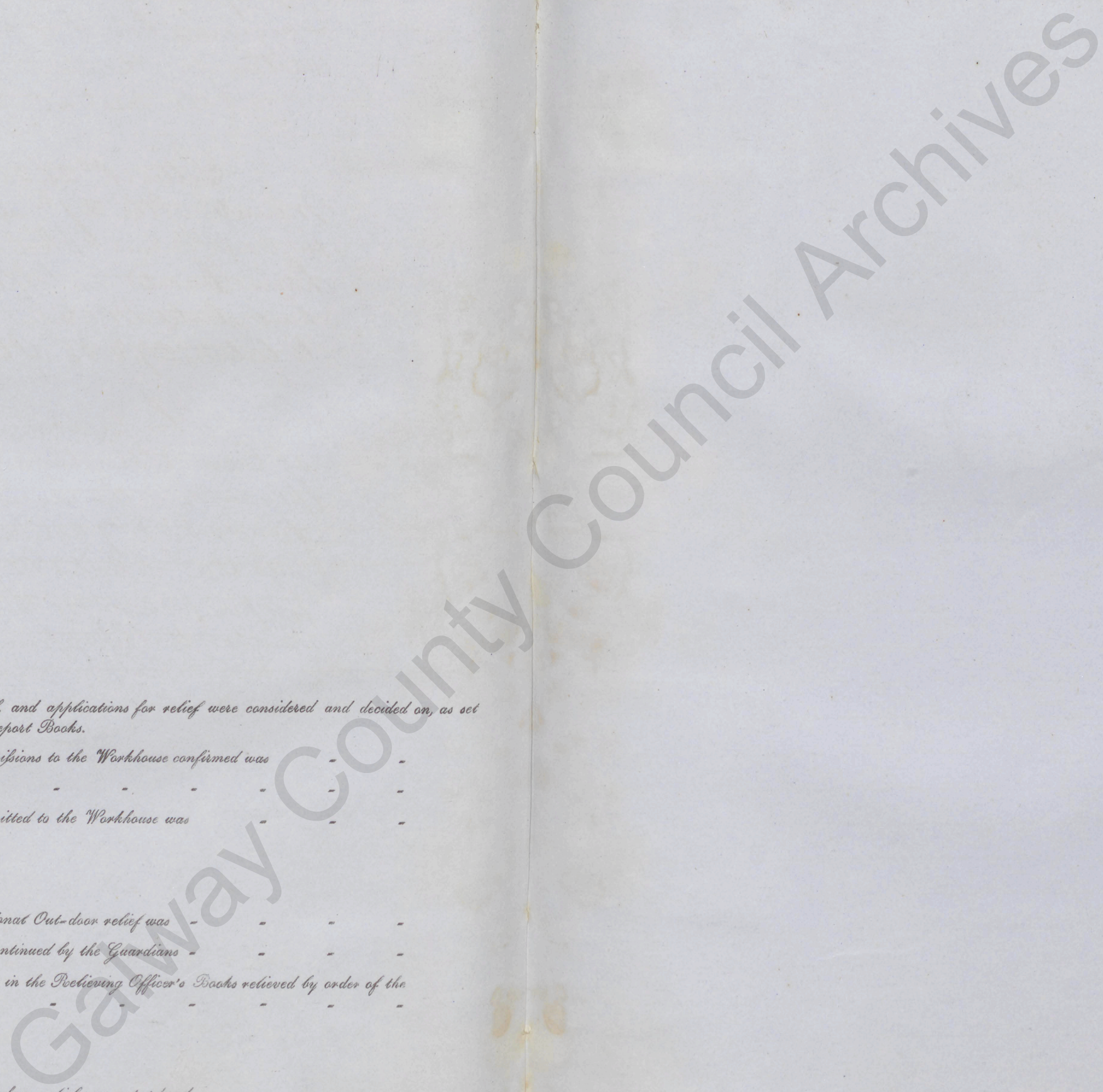
