Union conceive the Commissioners are under a Misapprehension
with reference to this subject.

The Commissioners assume that these two Divisions
(Grange & Killinor) belong to the Dispensary District of
Loughrea, when one of them (Killinor) forms part of the
Dispensary District of Athenry. — The Commissioners

also suggest the arrangement with a view to economy,
The Guardians are of opinion that the Salaries of the Medical
officers of Loughrea and Athenry Districts cannot reasonably be
reduced the amount proposed to be given to the Medical officers of
the District suggested, by reason of taking one Division from each

These two Divisions of Grange and Killinor are comparatively
well off with a moderate population and a high Valuation

The Guardians of the Loughrea Union are of Opinion
that it is more the interest of the Union to have these Divisions
attached to the Loughrea & Athenry District, in which they now
are than to concede them to the adjoining Electoral Divisions
of the Ballinasloe Union.

The Rate payers of these Divisions are represented
at the Loughrea Board of Guardians & are constant
attendants there, while they are not represented at the
Ballinasloe Board of Guardians and they will consider
it a great security, if the proposed arrangement is preserved
in under all the circumstances

The Guardians do not at all consider it necessary
that a second Medical officer should be appointed for the
Loughrea District & would beg to refer the Commissioners
upon this subject to their explanation in Minutes of the 27th ult.

The population of the Loughrea District would only be reduced 1000 by the suggested change and the reduction in Athlone would only be another 1000

Upon the occasion of an Epidemic additional medical aid should become necessary the guardians are in a position to obtain such temporary aid.

With reference to delay the guardians would beg to remind the commissioners that they have not upon their part given any delay to the consideration of that or any other subject in relation to their duties as guardians

The guardians of the Loughrea Union would again request the attention of the commissioners to the large debt due by the Portumna Union to them which the Commissioners engaged should be paid

The financial State of the Divisions of the Loughrea Union having been considered, the Chairman felt it to be their duty to call the attention of the Commissioners to the situation of the Electoral Divisions of Loughrea and Soughatonick. The Division of Loughrea has paid since 1849, rates amounting to 17th in the pound actually levied, and on the 25th March last owed a debt of £91.11.5⁴ and with reference to Soughatonick it formed part of the Union of Carriff till February 1858 when it became a portion of the Loughrea Union at which period it was largely in debt, the rates struck since that time on this Division have amounted to 12th in the pound notwithstanding which it owed on the 25th March last £18.18.9 which upon its Valuation of £166 would amount to more than 11th in the pound without including its current expenses

The Division of Derrylawr is similarly situated and under all these circumstances the attention of the Commissioners is requested to the matter with the hope that relief may be obtained from the Treasury for these Divisions upon the same ground that relief was afforded to the Division of Woodford
