The Guardians have already provided a suitable outfit in accordance with the Emigration Commissioners Regulations prepared in the Workhouse, the cost of which is £2, and it is proposed to give in addition £2, to proceed to Plymouth and provide any necessary articles she may want, and also to have a little money at her disposal on landing at the Port of her destination.

The Guardians never contemplated so large or expensive a building as that indicated by the plan. Mr. Bawle, the Inspector suggested the necessity of providing temporary accommodation for industrial purposes so that the Infirmary ward might be applied to the purposes originally intended and which would cost about £80, the Guardians preferred to build a permanent Edifice that would suit the present purpose and eventually answer for a Hospital the cost of which was estimated at about £160.

The Guardians upon further consideration are of opinion that the two Arched Sheds now used for turf and straw stores in the Male and Female Yards may be converted into Infirmary wards in connection with the Hospital at a trifling expense and that suitable storage accommodation of a permanent nature may be provided in convenient places in these yards at a comparatively small expense perhaps for £80 or £100.
