With reference to the question of Salary the Guardians would remind the Commissioners that by their Letter of the 15<sup>th</sup> April 1850, 483 they were satisfied to sanction a Salary of £20 or £25 if the Divisions they suggested were added to the Woodlawn Dispensary in the Ballinacree Union, while they now refuse to sanction a larger Salary on the grounds of being insufficient

The Guardians have yielded their own Opinion with the view of meeting that of the Commissioners so far as the appointment of a second Medical Officer & they hope & request that the Commissioners will not insist upon any increase of the Salary recommended by the Guardians for the second Medical Officer. It may be necessary to add that the Medical Officer in question was perfectly satisfied with the Salary agreed upon by the Guardians.
