Letter from the Lieutenant Colonel of the 11th Regt, dated Portmouth the 2nd Inst in reply to a resolution of the Board passed on the 31st Ultimo, relative to the admission into the Workhouse of Margaret Reddan & Child the wife of Rich^d Reddan, and stating that she had been allowed the privilege of residing in Barracks but was on more than one occasion deprived of that advantage in consequence of her dissolute Conduct and intemperate and irregular habits

Resolved, that in consequence of the bad character above stated, given by the Colonel of Margaret Reddan that herself and Child be discharged from this Workhouse on Monday next she being an able bodied woman. Letter from the Guardians Union dated 25th Ultimo forwarding a copy of a resolution of that Board to the effect, that a Petition be presented to Parliament praying to have the Tenant right of Ulster legalized and its principles extended throughout Ireland
