On last Saturday there were 93 fever cases in the Ward since then I admitted 29 new cases making a total of 122. which is independent of the other cases in hospital, a greater number than any one Medical man can attend, at least should they continue to increase at an equal rate, to prevent which I would beg to suggest that persons actually in fever should no longer be admitted.
