The Vice guardians proceeded to examine the tenders for Supplying the Workhouse with New Milk & Buttermilk to the 2d September next.

The tender of Walter Plunket to Supply New Milk @ 1/- Buttermilk @ 3/- per gallon was accepted, securities, Mr P. McCarthy & M<sup>r</sup> H. Kelly.

Fifteen Candidates for the office of Overseer of Out door Labourers and Surveyor Officer (vacant by the resignation of P. O'Byrne) presented themselves, and the Vice guardians considered John Rogerson to be the most eligible.

He was therefore appointed at a salary of 1/- per week.

In Reference to the Commissioners letter of the 8<sup>th</sup> inst the Vice Guardians called upon the Clerk to resign, when he requested to be allowed to defer doing so until Wednesday next as he wished to communicate with the Commissioners on the subject, The Vice guardians acceded to his request.

Gentlemen, - We the Community of Mount Carmel, respectfully beg leave to submit to your consideration the heavy taxation we are subject to in consequence of the very high value put on this Institution and the few acres of land attached to it, in connection with this Establishment there is a poor school where 500 children are educated and (when enabled by the kindness of friends through the labours and exertions of the Religious) a breakfast is supplied to their suffering beings. Having been informed that in other Unions Establishments

Such as Ours, devoted to the Education & Relief of the Poor, have been exempted from poor rates, such as the Convents of the Sisters of Mercy and presentation at Salway. May we not hope to experience a similar favor at your hands.

It has been at all times a Matter of surprise that Our Establishment had been rated in the Assessment, it being the general Opinion that such places do not come under the Poor Law Act. As yet we have not been able to relieve ourselves from the burthen, however being in possession of your kind and considerate exertions, not alone in behalf of the poor, but in correcting all other abuses where such existed within the Union. We take the liberty of soliciting your gracious attention to the subject assuring you that such kindness shall never be forgotten by the community and that it is a blessing in the present state of our circumstances we anxious by trust will be restored upon us.
