Mr. John Smyth Solicitor attended the meeting of the Board and laid before the Guardians the opinion received from Counsel as to their claims to the Poor's property of Athony and the mode to be adopted for its recovery

Counsel states that the nature of the title of the late Corporation to the property is not sufficiently stated to enable him to offer any opinion on its validity but assuming the title of the late Corporation to be good the title of the Electoral Division to have the property made available is clear

The rate payers can (and it is their best course) present and assert their claims without calling on the Guardians to aid them

The simplest, Cheapest, and most conclusive course for the rate payers to take is to file a chancery petition in the name of the Attorney General against the Guardians and also against the persons in the possession of the property, or the receipts of the profits since the right of the Guardians occurred, and as the latter will be primarily responsible to the extent of the funds so raised by them the rate payers can and ought to abandon all claim against the Guardians, thus for the future the funds will be properly applied and for the past, those only will be compelled to refund who have taken and kept the tolls or the other rents, issues, and profits

The Medical Officer Reported

Dr. Lynch begs to report that the supply of clothing in the poor house is at present inadequate for the wants of the inmates, a large quantity has been condemned and ought to be disposed of at once in a sanitary point of view. The hospital gags are all so thin and injured from repeated washing being in use during the last twelve years as to be unfit for use and the ticks for similar reasons, should be replaced by new ones. Warmer clothing for the convalescent patients is much required and he would advise a proper number of great coats to be made for that purpose and for the infirm males, The outside petticoats in use amongst the adult female, require to be replaced by new ones of a warmer description and a similar change in the childrens frocks would be desirable. - if the straw bedding in the hospital were gradually replaced by cocoa nut fibre beds it would be a great boon to the sick and considering the price of straw would not be ultimately more expensive, It would be very desirable if the meat supplied for hospital purposes were contracted for as "meat without bones" the small quantity of meat allowed in the sick dietary being still further diminished by the frequent presence in the ration of a large proportion of bones, the tea and sugar supplied to the hospital for the sick is of the worst description and much objected to by the patients.

I beg to state that the salary paid me for the last quarter is 15⁷/₄ less than I consider myself entitled to. The change in the salaries of the Master, Matron and Schoolmistress is calculated to and from the 4th August, the day on which the salaries of the two latter officers were fixed, and it was on that day that my salary was proposed by the Board at £50 and sanctioned on the 18th the date to which I consider myself entitled to payment at my former salary— As the Master and Matron intend to look for similar situations vacant in another Union they respectfully solicit the Board for testimonials and request two days leave of absence.

In explanation of the Master's application respecting his salary, the Clerk stated that the resolution to £50 having been made on the 4th August at the instance of the Poor Law Commissioners, he did not think the Master entitled to pay at a higher rate beyond that date— in the instances of the Matron and Schoolmistress's salaries they were allowed the unreduced salary to the date of the Commissioners' sanction as the reductions were made by simple motion of the Board and required the former's sanction before being acted upon, and not as, in the Master's case, on the recommendation of the Commissioners, which he was of opinion rendered the former's resolution fraudulent thereon at once operative.

The Guardians thought the Master entitled to the higher rate of pay to the 10th of August the date of the former's sanction but not to the 18th as stated by him— they declined giving a testimonial as they thought it an unusual course to give officers testimonials whilst continuing in their employment, — leave of absence was granted the Master and Matron as requested, —

We have examined the entire stock of clothing in the house and recommend to be condemned several worn out articles a detailed list of which we give below, which should be immediately sorted and sold by auction. In many instances, the supply of serviceable articles of wear on hand is not equal to the requirements, We would therefore recommend to be provided 50 new rugs for

Hospital use, also 50 new suits of men's clothing consisting of Coats, Waistcoats and trousers, 10 men's overcoats, 20 pairs of men's clozes, 40 women's wrappers, 100 outside petticoats, 100 aprons, 50 Caps, and 20 Children's frocks— There being no materials in store for the making up of any of these articles it will be necessary to take contracts for 200 yds. serge, 170 yds. Bengal stripe, 400 yds. senary-wolsey, 20 yds. blue calico and 100 yds. of check.

The introduction of coal as fuel will render necessary an alteration to the grates of the house, we have been informed that about 20 grates will require such and we recommend that false bottoms be provided and two extra bars at the lower front of each, to be so arranged as to be removable when the use of turf shall be again resorted to, The Stoves room grate requires a firebrick back and the grate in the Clerk's office to be replaced by a new one.

As we learn that the annual contracts for supplies will expire by the end of November, the clothing materials required can be included in the advertisements for the new general contracts, - it would be well however that the alterations necessary to the grates be made as speedily as possible, owing to a difficulty in procuring a sufficiency of turf being felt. 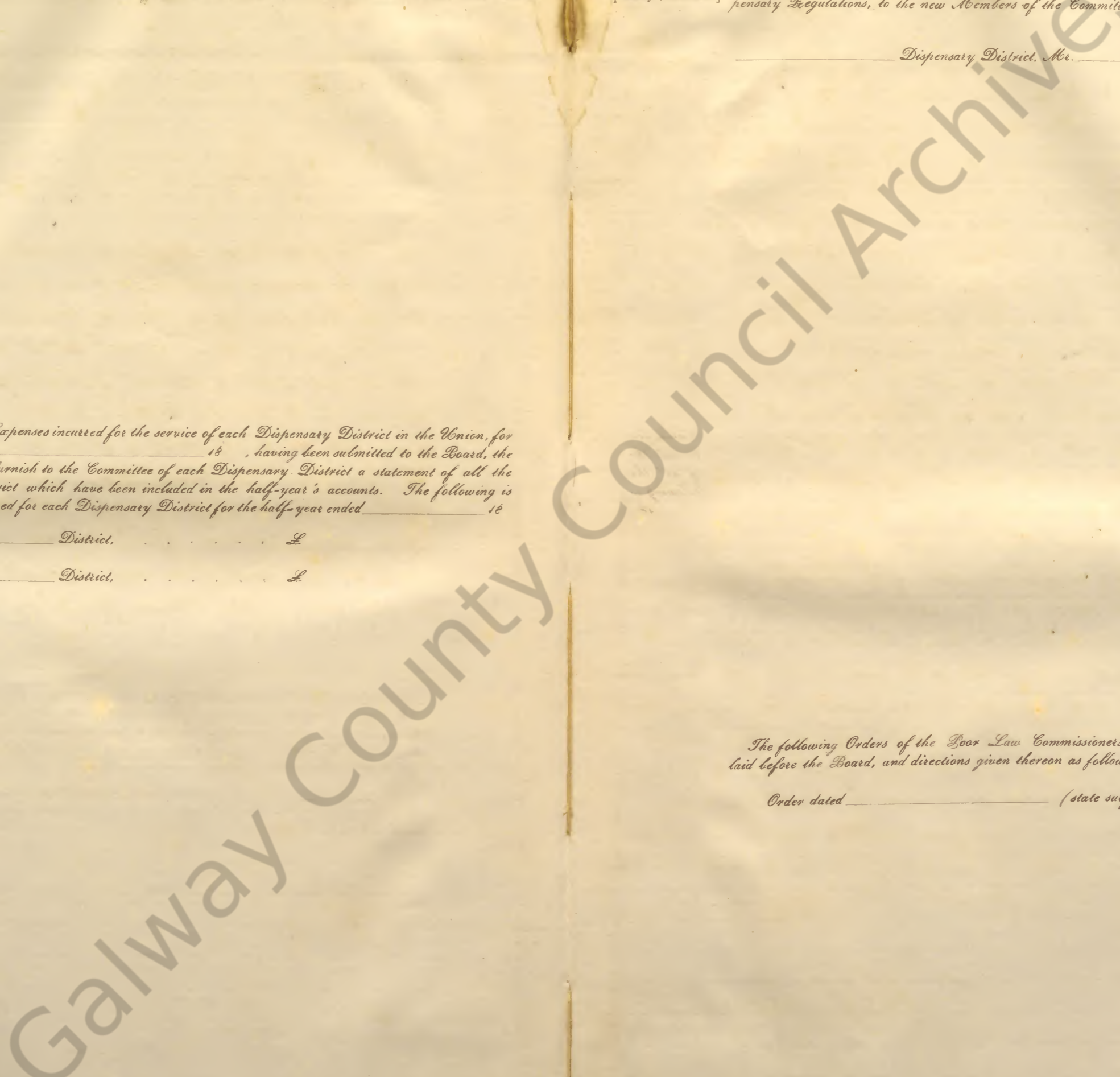

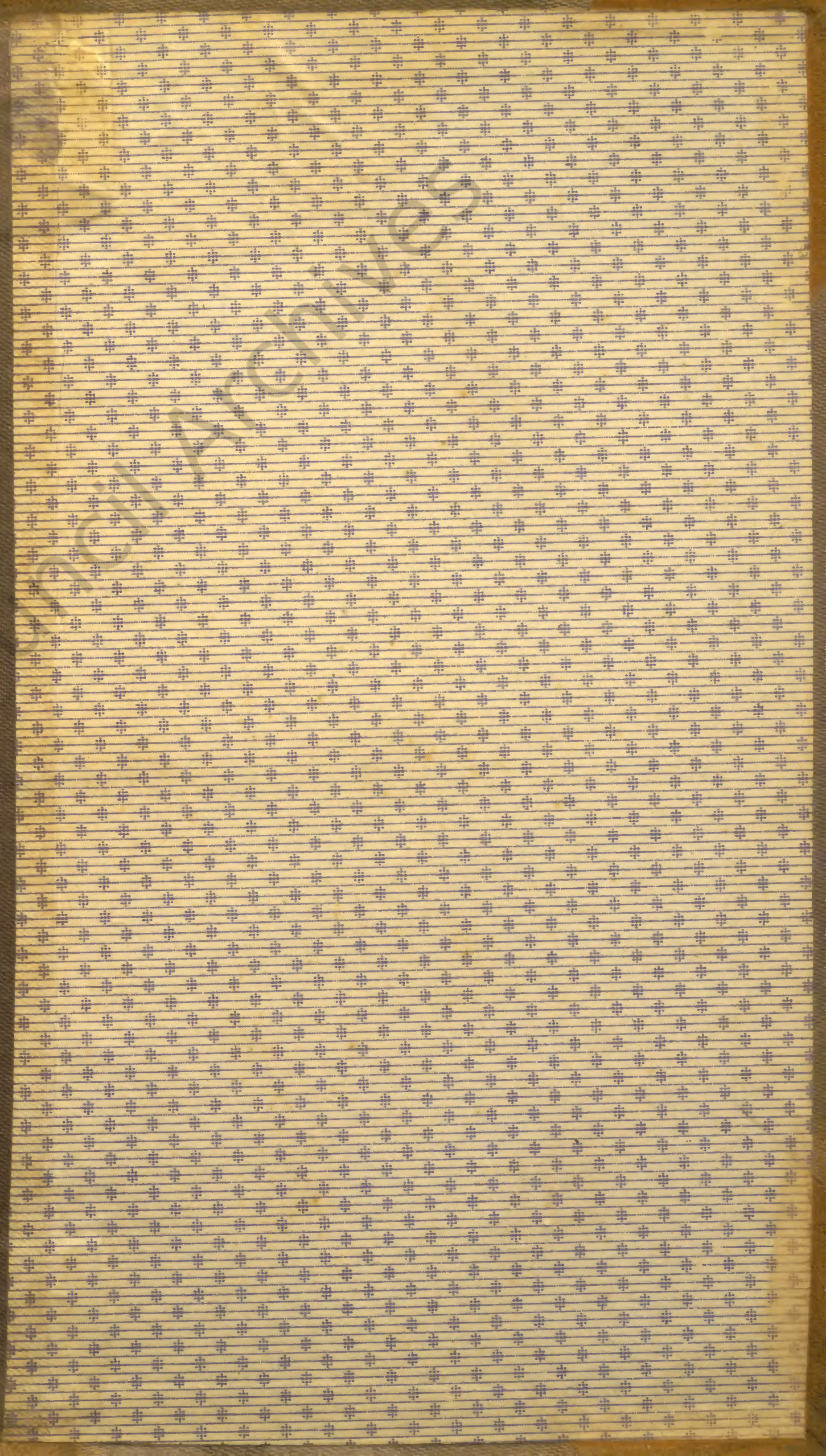
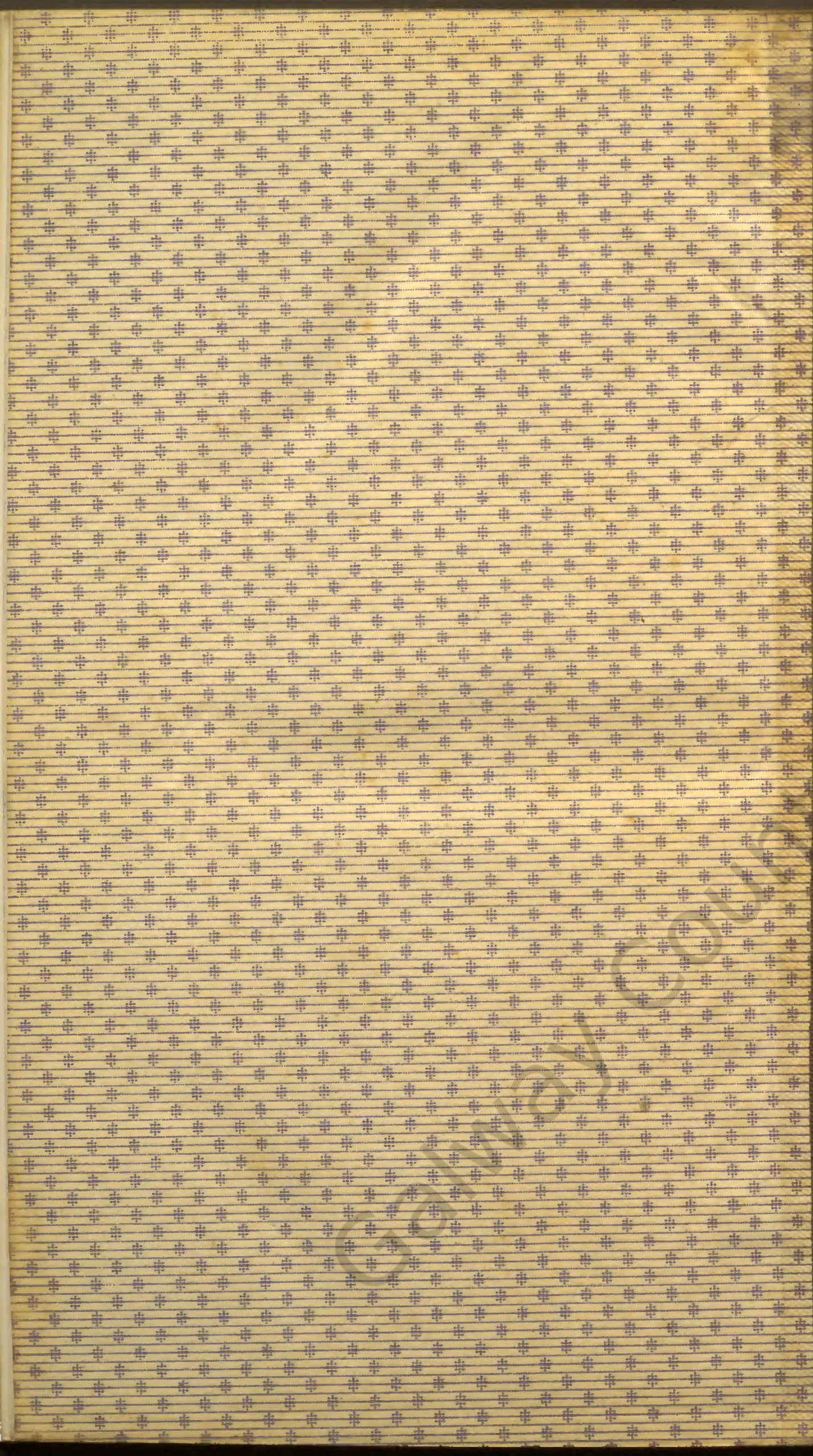
