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

The Board of Guardians having advertised for tenders for the erection of a boundary Wall to the Workhouse ground have received a proposal from Mr Lawrence Baker to execute the work at the rate of £3,3<sup>10</sup> per running statute perch. It is calculated that the whole expense will amount to about £500 which the Contractor stipulates to have paid to him in four instalments during the progress of the work.
