The Government is benevolent toward such developments and the Guild have had yery encouraging discussions with the Regional Arts advisor, it is hoped to stage an opening exhibition early in I980, all going well.

Their requirements are; (1) Moveable stage, (2) Carpet-tiled floor,

- (3) Curtains, (4) Stage lighting, (5) Decoration of Theatre,
- (6) New seating (200 chairs) (7) New Box office (8) New sound system
- (9) Signposting, (10) Coffee bar, (11) Heating, all of which is expected to come to £10,000 plus. Items needing attention by the Landlord are new Toilets and windows. The group hope to raise the money in various ways and will qualify for grants now available, They seek a new lease-hold agreement with the Board. The Chairman said it is ro be hoped we can meet some of the requirements in time and to get a lease drafted. He complimented them on their venture. P. M. Stapleton proposed that as a gesture of help we waive the £56 p a rent over 5 years.

HIGH ST. TRADERS; The Board again reveived a deputation from the High St. Traders, Messrs P. MChugh, V. Keaveney, Mrs McIntyre, and Mrs Hallion.

Mr. McHugh speaking for the group said that whilst they dont want to see congestion of the street neither did they want a freeway as is now.

Their three requests are; (1) Eliminate Yellow lines on High Street.

(2) Widen Road on Cemetry, side and remove lower half thereof for Gar park. (3) Restore entry from Smiths up to T. Murphy's junction. The Chairman would not accept any demand to take away half the old Cemetery- which was not a previous demand - personally he would not condone any such move. G. Browne proposed and Kevin Dwyer seconded that we meet again with Garda Superentendant on the question of parking on both sides of the Street, Sec. to so arrange a meeting.

20 McHale Tce. Commiss. J. Keane raised a question (which he had mentioned at july Meeting) regarding the reported re-sale of 20 McHale Tce, which was not authorised by the Board to the present occupier and where unauthorised developments was carried out without planning permission also. The matter is to be placed on Sept. agenda for report.

URBANISATION The A. S. Co. Manager stated that as he proposes to have an additional Co. Council viewpoint (which is being prepared) inserted into his report, he asked that be left over to the Sept. agenda, this was agreed.

Manager's Business

(a) Appointment of Town Clerk

The Assistant Manager referred to Resolution at the March meeting requesting the Minister to approve the creation of a whole-time office of Town Clerk. This resolution had been conveyed to the Department of the Environment and he had had talks with officers there who indicated that sanction would not be forthcoming to the proposal. The Manager explained that none of the Town Commissioners in the country were served by a whole-time Town Clerk.

In the circumstances, a proposal had now been submitted to the Department requesting the Minister to amalgamate the office of Clerical Officer in the Assistant Co. Engineer's office with that of Town Clerk. It was proposed that the holder of the former office be promoted to Staff Officer (Grade V) and that the Town Commissioners would have his services by paying the difference between the Clerical Officer and the Grade V rate. This would be less than they would have to pay for a part-time Town Clerk at the current salary scale. This proposal had been discussed with the Co. Manager before it was submitted to the Department and the latter had also agreed that he would second a Clerk Typist to the A.C.E.'s office to assist with the arrangement. The Co. Council would bear the cost of employing this officer.

Following a discussion on the matter, the Town Commissioners unanimously agreed to the Assistant Co. Manager's proposal in regard to the permanent appointment of Town Clerk.

(b) Financial position

The Assistant Co. Manager referred to proposal for new works on the Agenda and stated that it would not be possible to enter into a commitment for further new works pending the clarification of the financial situation of the Commissioners. This was causing concern and he was having the position examined. The basic cause of the problem was that approximately half of the investments held some years ago had been realised in order to defray the cost of bathroom additions. This meant that income from investments which had boosted the revenue account was reduced by approximately half. Formerly, this would have entailed an adjustment of the rate poundage, but in the years in question, a ceiling had been imposed on the amount of upward adjustment which could be made. The Assistant Manager undertook to bring the matter again before the Board when financial records had been brought up to date.

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N.O.M. J.Bukke (1) The matter of boilers - finance problem was left over to the next meeting

These resulted in no change other than that a one Hour parking was acceeded on the north side of High Street. This would afford a two hundred % parking availability to shoppers. Commiss. Bourke and Browne expressed hopes that both-side parking will be allowed. In reply to queries by Commiss. Kelly, O'Connell and O'Mara the Engineer undertook to look into doing work on the High Street side of Templejarlath this year.

Bath. Rooms.... The Chairman referred to complaints of dampmess where new bathrooms were fitted. Commiss. In opening the meeting the Chairman Commissioner Campbell said he would take the E.S.B. matter first and welcomed Mr Hunter and Mr Muldoon to the meeting. TRAFFIC IN HIGH ST AREA.

Commissioner Burke said they needed some specific word from the meeting for the High St; traders re their deputation about the parking problems in that area, Commissioner Browne said the new system had affected business in all areas of the town and refered to two customers of his own who got tickets while parked to collect goods, Commissioner Keane said someone had to suffer to improve the old traffic system and the Chairman Commissioner Campbell said some of the affairs refered to by the Shop St traders were being attended to by the Town Engineer.

Commissioner Browne proposed that the board recisend the Gaming & Dotteries Act the reasons he had given in past meetings but he did not wish to affect charitable organisations in this matter and in reply to questions Mr Howlett said the Commissioners could resving Part 3 of this act that they adopted in 1959 which would then prevent the opening of an Amusement Hall in the town. In reply to Commissioner Browne he said he would consult with Loughrea Commissioners and with the board's solicitor on the whole legal aspect of this and the Chairman Commissioner Campbell said he could then entertain a formal motion on this when they had got full legal aid re the situtation.

FLOODING ON TUAM/GALWAY RD:

Commissioner Browne asked if the Council had taken any action in this matter

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and Mr Howlett said a grant had been made available for this type of work and he would again ask that the part of road near Two-Mile -Ditch be attended to.

MEAT STALLS.

Mr Howlett spoke of an increase in the rent on the Stalls at Vicar St up to a new rate of between £7 and £10 per week, the stalls were valued between £3,000 and £5,000 and as the tenants had not replied to an earlier letter re this matter it was now in the hands of the solicitor.

Mr Hopkins wished to buy his stall xxx the price of £3,000 and the solicitor suggested that they accept this and have a formal motion to that effect on a future agenda, This was proposed by Commissioner Kelly seconded by Commissioner Joyce.

Commissioner Browne sauggested that they treat all clients alike as the Liberary had been rented to the Council for half nothing over the years.

PEDESTERIAN CROSSINGS.

The town engineer Mr Gibbons spoke of the proposed new pedesterian crossings for the town which had been agreed on also by the Gardai but Commissioner O'Connell said they also needed one on Dublin Rd; at McCormacks corner and Commissioner Burke said one was needed beside the schools there while Commissioner Keane said there was an urgent need for a similar crossing at the Ballygaddy Rd; Round-About. Commissioners Browne and Joyce suggestee one for Bishop St from the Car Pk to the Church entrance and in reply to questions the engineer said there would be an island in the Square of similar nature to a footpath in size where even a person with a pram would remain while crossing.

The engineer said he would look at the possibilities of the extra crossings at Dublin Rd; and at Smyth's and on the proposal of Commissioner Kelly seconded by Commissioner Keane the board accepted the suggested changes.

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TWINNING WITH TOWN IN FRANCE.

The Chairman refered to the letter re the twinning of Tuam with Coigers in France and said they would need all the other bodies in Tuam in on this to form a sub-committe on this matter, Commissioner JKeane said that as the elected representatives they should go ahead on their own but Commissioner Kelly said that they aske Mr Curley of the organisation to meet them and Mr Howlett said he would contact him re this, on the proposal of Commissioner Kelly seconded by Commissioner O'Mara it was decided to write to the Chamber of Commerce asking that they send a deputation to discuss the matter at the next meeting.

TOWN CLERK RESIGNS.

The Town Clerk had given in his notice to leave to Mr Howlett before the meeting and the board regretted that he was leaving due to the amount of work involved and each of the members and the Chairman paid tribute to his work during his time in the Town Hall.

Mr Gilmore thanked the Commissioners, the Asst Co.Manager and the Town Engineer for all their help and kindness over the last year and a half.

MOTION FROM COMMISSIONER O'CONNELL.

Speaking about his motion re the Council be asked to review the costings of the sites in the Fairgreen Commissioner O'Connell said the price of £5,000 was far above what they had expected and as the first sites had been so much cheaper he did'nt think the present ones would cost more than £2,000 and was very disappointed with the figure.

MOTION FROM COMMISSIONER BURKE.
