The Commissioners examined the various items of expenditure and receipts proposed by the Manager in the draft estimate. During the course of the discussion it was stated that despite some increase, the funds for house repairs were still inadequate, having regard to the condition of houses. Commissioner Stapleton exhorted the Manager to be slow in transferring Tenants from one house to another as this was costing the Board big money in repairing the vacent houses before reletting. A proposal was made that the rent of the Town Hall should be increased. #### Rent Collection

A Chara,

In his report on the collection for 1986 the Local Government Auditor referred to the fact that the amount collected represented 82.79% of the total amount accrued.

During 1987 there was some improvement in the collection and the percentage collected increased to 84.25%. This improvement has been maintained for the first half of this year. first half of this year.

The Auditor also noted that nearly all of the arrears were accounted for by a few Tenants. At the end of 1987 an amount of £2574 out of a total arrears of £2596 is accounted for by eight defaulters. All of these cases were referred to the Solicitor when they fell into arrears. We have since gained possession of two of the houses and arrears of £1324 will probably have to be written off. Five other Tenants are paying off arrears by instalment. We are about to start proceedings for the recovery of possession of the final house.

In the circumstances action will have been taken on most of the outstanding Calman cases by the end of the present year.

The Chairman welcomed Mr. S. Keating, County Manager, He thanked him for giving the Commissioners the opportunity of addressing Galway County Council at their meeting on Monday 25th April, 1988. He hoped that agreement could be reached between the Board and the Manager re: the inclusion of extra townlands in the proposed extension to the Town boundary.

Mr. Keating stated that normally the extension of a town boundary was related to development needs. There is no development need in Tuam as the Commissioners are not a planning Authority, providing services—water, sewerage, roads etc. It is a representation question. He said the proposed extension was quite excessive. He had doubts that the Minister would approve because of the size of the increase, from 603 acres to 2,677 acres. He agreed there was no precedent to guide them and advised against increasing the acerage over that proposed in his memo.

The Assistant County Manager stated that he agreed with the County Manager. Guidelines were laid down by the Department when enquiries about extension of the Town boundary were first made.

All present expressed the opinion that if agreement could be reached between the Town Commissioners and Galway County Council the Minister would also agree. It was noted that in the 1986 Census the population inside the existing boundary dropped while the population of the environs increased, and that current development is taking place in the environs. It was agreed the County Council had done an indepth study and what was offered was reasonable, but the Manager was asked to reconsider and include Kilcloghens (40 houses) and Drum (24 houses) where development is already taking place.

The Manager stated that Urban Status may be a factor. The size of the Town raised important implications if it became an Urban Council in the future and would involve the transfer of resources - related to the size of acerage - from Galway County Council. He refused to include the two townlands proposed by the Board.

It was then proposed by Commissioner Browne that the smaller area be accepted. This was supported by Commissioners O'Mara and O'Grady. It was proposed by Commissioner Burke that the Board go to the Minister and seek the two extra townlands. This was supported by Commissioners Kelly, Halion, Biggins and Chairman Stapleton. It was finally resolved to go back to the County Council and seek their support in having Drum and Kilcloghens included in the extension before submitting the proposal to the Minister.
