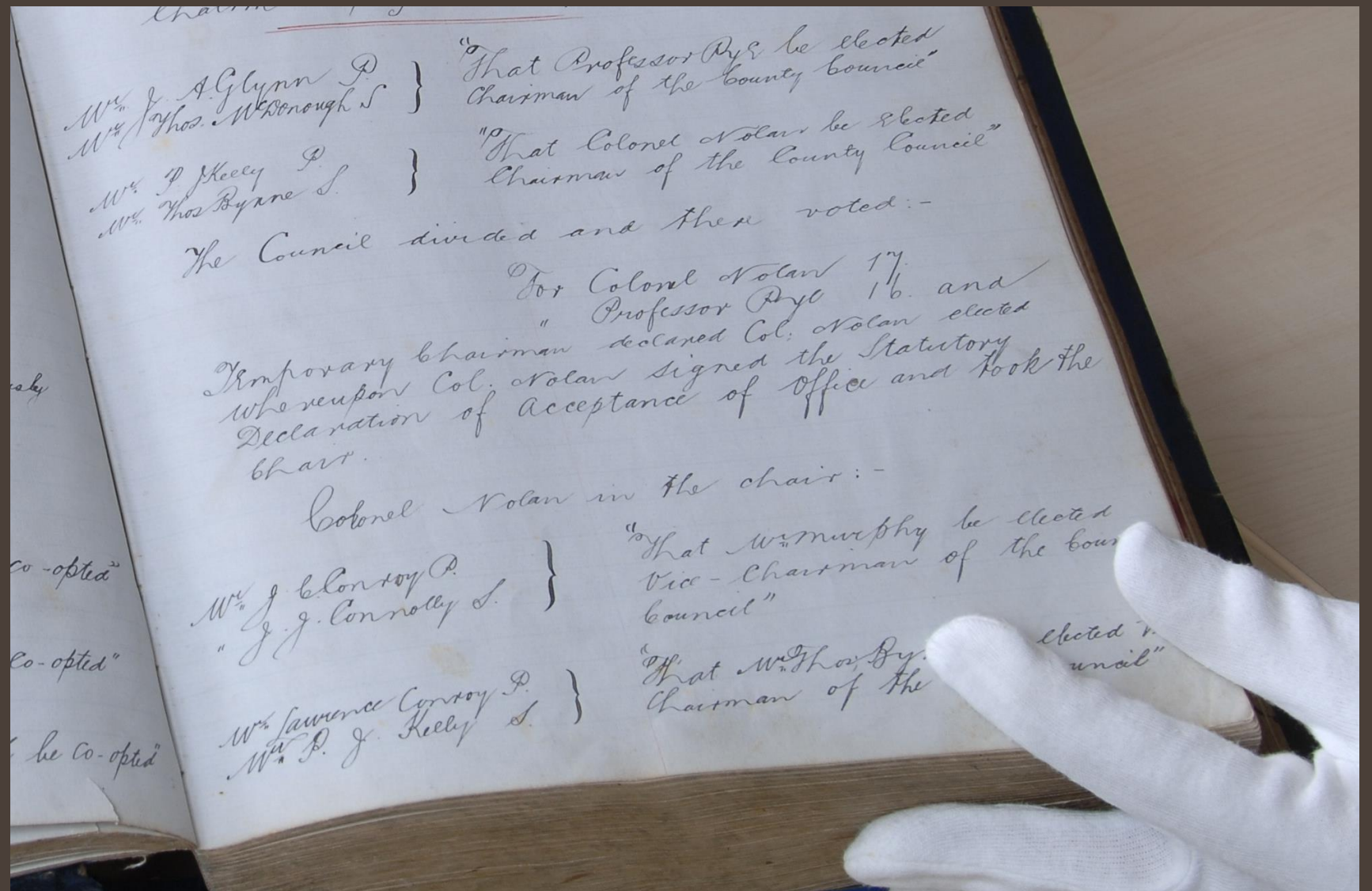

THE NEW COUNCILS.

UPON last Saturday throughout Ireland the various District Councils met and set about preparing for work. They appointed their chairmen and ex-officio representatives by law authorised and so far commenced the first chapter of what promises to be a new era in the administrative life of this country. For good or ill, for better or for worse and we believe it will be all for the better, the new bodies are launched upon the hitherto stormy sea of Irish life and it is to be hoped that from a sense of patriotism if from no other consideration, the Councils now commencing their careers will by all classes and at all hands be accorded a fair trial neither condemned beforehand for inefficiency nor unduly commended for efficiency but given a full, unprejudiced and honest trial. It is the interest of no man anxious for the welfare of the country and for its reputation before the world for common sense and practical patriotism to embarrass and hamper the working of these new boards. Throwing unnecessary difficulties in their way means piling costs upon their administration and making their honest and well-meant attempt to do their duty an expensive and troublesome task. The new bodies deserve from the Irish public and will, we are sure, receive every consideration and fair play and while men of tried experience may not be allowed on the present occasion an opportunity of taking part in their deliberations we hope they will in every way for the common good of the country indirectly lend to them the benefit of their knowledge of
